## This funding will be used to


- Increase the number of students achieving at/above PM Regional Reading Benchmarks (as a minimum) at the end of term 4 from 31% of students (8 out of 26 students in 2021) to 65% (18 students out of 27 students in 2022).
- Ensure that 85% percent of students (22 out of 27 students) are receiving a 'C' or above in English and Mathematics in 2022 and increase the amount of 'A' and 'B' in English and Mathematics from 15% (4 out of 26 students in 2021) to 37% (10 out of 27 students in 2022)
- Continue to implement and strengthen teacher capability in actioning Leyburn State School's Whole School Plan and Reading Framework ensuring the Australian Curriculum is aligned to the Queensland Kindergarten Learning Guidelines.

## Our initiatives include

- Provide targeted professional development and coaching to strengthen teachers' understanding of the Australian Curriculum and alignment with the Queensland Kindergarten Learning Guidelines.
- Using data walls to track student outcomes with dedicated professional learning community (PLC) sessions that provide timely targeted case management of identified students.
- Provide focussed and intensive intervention by teacher aides for students requiring additional support.
- Develop and enact responsive intervention plans that are informed by student data and case meetings with DoE pathologists and other professionals.

Funding a Department of Education Speech Language Pathologist fortnightly to assist in the development, support and implementation of Speech, Reading and Literacy intervention programs.	\$13,307.32
Providing professional development opportunities for intentional collaboration between Principal, Teachers and other relevant Department of Education staff and colleagues to enhance student outcomes.	\$1100.00
Funding a Teacher Aide to work with identified students to deliver case management and data informed Literacy and Numeracy intervention programs.	\$8,450.68
